Gala 150th Anniversary Celebration At the Cincinnati Museum Center At Union Terminal

The year-long celebration of the 150th anniversary of the Valley of Cincinnati culminates on Saturday, September 13, 2003 with both a day and evening program at one of Cincinnati's premier showcases, Cincinnati Museum Center at Union Terminal.

During the day, bring the entire family down to the historic art deco facility that houses three exciting museums and the only OMNIMAX Theater in the area. There is the Cincinnati History Museum, the Museum of Natural History & Science, Cinergy Children's Museum and the Robert D. Lindner Family OMNIMAX Theater. After you visit the museums and

theater, join us for a special luncheon served in a private dining room from 11:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. exclusively to Scottish Rite members and their guests. In short, this day promises something for everyone, especially for your children and grandchildren. Tickets are available through advance mail order only, \$10.00 for adults and \$7.50 for children. The ticket price includes admission to two

museums, the OMNIMAX Theater and lunch. The event is from 10:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m.

pleasing sound of dinner music. After a brief dinner program, the dishes will be cleared away and the magnificent seventeen-piece big band sound of the Tom Daugherty Orchestra will fill the rotunda. Nostalgic favorites include music from Tommy Dorsey, Glenn Miller and all the familiar big band favorites. When the band takes a break, view a special private showing of Shackleton's Antarctic Adven-

ture in the OMNIMAX Theater. Following the OMNIMAX showing, the Tom Daugherty Orchestra will strike up the big band sound again for more dancing.

Fall Reunion Commemorates Ohio Bicentennial

Fall Reunion will be a one-day event. Four degrees will be conferred on Saturday, November 15, 2003. "We have begun a new century where events and lives move at a faster pace than ever before," commented Mick. Continuing, he stated, "it is imperative that we give these men the opportunity to enjoy the benefits of Scottish Rite Freemasonry in a streamlined format."

American Legion Past National Commander To Speak At Special 9/11 Program

The first meeting of the fall season will be of intense interest to all Scottish Rite Masons in the Valley of Cincinnati in addition to being a day of national remembrance. Because the stated meet-

ing falls on the second anniversary of the 9/11 tragedy, the valley will be setting aside all business for the day and focus on the significance of an event that will remain forever in the national psyche.

A speaker of national prominence has agreed to participate in the program. The Honorable H.F. "Sparky" Gierke, Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces in Washington, D.C., will deliver the principal address of the evening. Judge Gierke is a Past National Commander of the American Legion, the first Vietnam Era Commander to lead the 3,000,000-member organization.

Judge Gierke is a distinguished jurist, having served on the North Dakota State Supreme Court. He is past president of a number of bar associations and currently

is an adjunct professor of law at George Washington University Law School and Columbus School of Law of the Catholic University of America.

Judge Gierke served as a Captain in the Judge Advocate General's Corps of the Army from May, 1967 to April, 1971. From December, 1969 to December, 1970 he served as a full-time trial judge in the Republic of Vietnam where he was awarded the Bronze Star and Air Medal for Meritorious Service.

The program on September 11 promises to have a powerful impact. The disaster that occurred two years ago is a searing reminder of the fragility and vulnerability of the American way of life. It is also a tribute to the tenacity and endurance of the American people to overcome adversity. 32° Masons will join citizens throughout the nation in recalling the event and those who lost their lives.

Dinner will be served in the Scottish Rite Ballroom at the Cincinnati Masonic Center at 6:30 p.m. Tickets are \$10 each for both the dinner and program. Members may obtain up to two guest tickets at no charge for Masons who are considering petitioning for membership in the Scottish Rite. Charles Albert Brigham, Jr., 33°

Born Dec. 9, 1924
Died Feb. 23, 2003



Our Brother was born at Baltimore, Maryland, on December 9, 1924, the eldest of the four children of Charles Albert and Dorothy D. Brigham. His family, native to New England, removed permanently

to Cincinnati a few months after his birth. Brother Brigham attended Madisonville Elementary School and graduated from Walnut Hills High School in 1942.

Following three years of service as a weather observer and instrument technician in the Army Air Corps in World War II, he completed his education at the University of Cincinnati. He received the degree of Bachelor of Arts in June 1948 and the degree of Juris Doctor in September 1949.

Admitted to the Bar in 1950, Brother Brigham engaged in the private practice of law in Cincinnati. He was the senior member of the family firm of Brigham and Brigham. During his practice, he served some years as Chairman of the Real Property Law Committee of the Cincinnati Bar Association.

Among other business interests, Charles was a director of the Lockland Building and Loan Association and served as president of the Buckeye Land Title Company.

On April 10, 1948, Brother Brigham married Martha Ann Otting. They became the parents of four children, Cynthia (Grant), Barbara (Antell), Elizabeth, and Charles A. Brigham III. These children produced for the elder Brighams seven grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

Following many years of protracted illness Martha passed from this life and subsequently Charles Albert married Janet Greer on May 5, 1995, a lovely lady and widow with three grown sons. Their life together spanned almost eight years.

In religious matters our Brother was an active layman in the Westwood United Methodist Church. He served in many capacities including Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the church. Brother Brigham served both as secretary and president of the Executive Board of

Trustees of the Methodist Home on College Hill (now known as Twin Towers). Until his retirement, he served as President of the Board of Trustees at Wesley Hall.

In other activities he organized and served three terms as President of the Oak Hills Swim and Racquet Club. He maintained a lifelong interest and membership in the Cincinnati and American Bar Associations, Lawyer's Club of Cincinnati, Ohio Land Title Association, Cincinnati Mortgage Bankers' Association, Cincinnati Exchange Club (served a term as President), Cincinnati Historical Society, The Cincinnati Club, and the Society of Mayflower Descendants.

Brother Brigham was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Madisonville Lodge No. 419 on April 18, 1946, and served as its Worshipful Master in 1955. In the mid nineties the lodge built a new Masonic temple and the building was named the **Charles A. Brigham, Jr. Masonic Temple**. He was also a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Cincinnati, and served as Sovereign Prince of Dalcho Council, Princes of Jerusalem from 1974 to 1976. Our Brother was twice Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Valley of Cincinnati, devoting twelve years to that body. Other Masonic memberships included Price Hill Chapter No. 164, Royal Arch Masons; Cincinnati Council No. 1, Royal and Select Masons; Trinity Commandery No. 44, Knights Templar; Syrian Temple Shrine; Saint Columba Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine (served as Puissant Sovereign 1985); Royal Order of Jesters, Cincinnati Court No. 7; Royal Order of Scotland; Masonic Veterans Association; Society of Past Masters of Cincinnati and Vicinity (served as president in 1986); Honorary Legion of Honor, International Order of DeMolay; Westwood Chapter No. 290 Order of the Eastern Star; the Masonic Book Club; the Philalethes Society, and honorary memberships in several lodges. In October, 1976, at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Brother Brigham was coroneted a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33°, Honorary Member of the Supreme Council. He served for three years as President of the George Washington Masonic

Memorial Association, located in Alexandria, Virginia.

In 1971 and 1972, Brother Brigham served as District Deputy Grand Master in the First Masonic District of Ohio. Most Worshipful Brother Dale E. Fox appointed him Junior Grand Deacon in October, 1972. He subsequently served the various offices, and on October 19, 1979, he was elected, and on October 20, 1979, Brother Brigham was installed as Grand Master of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons of Ohio.

Our Most Worshipful Brother was indeed a stalwart giant in service to the fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons. He was known and loved by many Masons and others in our society. It was a great privilege for those of us who were so blessed. He passed to the Grand Lodge Above on February 23, 2003, after a lengthy illness.

A Masonic Funeral Service was conducted by Madisonville-Madeira Lodge No. 419, F. & A.M. at the Westwood United Methodist Church on February 28, 2003. The service was followed by the Fourteenth Degree Ring Service and a 33° Convocation of Memory conducted by Illustrious Chester G. Burton, 33°, Active Member of the Supreme Council. A large attendance of friends and Masonic associates were present. Funeral Services were held at Westwood United Methodist Church on Saturday, March 1 at 1:30 p.m. Interment was in Spring Grove Cemetery in Cincinnati, Ohio.
